

Life Changing Grace

“Amazing Grace” is a Christian hymn written by John Newton and published in 1779. This hymn is known worldwide being sung in almost every setting in different renditions but with the same familiar and soul penetrating words. Most recently, President Barack Obama sang it at the memorial service for Clementa Pinckney, one of the victims of the 2015 Charleston church shooting. If you tried, you can probably start to sing the hymn yourself. “Amazing grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a.....”

Grace is one of the most important concepts in Christianity, and I would argue for the world to embrace. Without it we become inhumane, and fast. Just read a history book covering the events of the last century to support that point. In the Bible, grace is God’s unconditional love bestowed upon underserving people. It is most clearly expressed in the life of Jesus Christ of Nazareth who forgave greedy rich people, the sexually promiscuous, religious zealots, etc. He taught that everyone needs it from God and should receive it through faith in Him, and by extension everyone is asked then to extend that grace received to others.
